

#### Attendance and Punctuality

Regular attendance and punctuality are essential for your child's learning and wellbeing. Please take note of the following reminders:

**Reporting Absences:** If your child is absent, please email the school with the reason for their absence or send a written note when they return.

**Appointments During School Hours:** If your child has an appointment during the school day, they must be signed out at the school office before being collected.

#### **Punctuality Matters:**

Arriving on time helps your child start the day calmly and confidently. Pupils arriving after 9:20am will be marked as late.

Monitoring: Attendance and punctuality are monitored by the school's Education Welfare Officer, who conducts audits throughout the year.

#### **Term-Time Holidays:**

Please avoid booking family holidays during term time. The school does not provide work for pupils who are absent due to holidays.

## Parking Safely: A Shared Responsibility

To help keep everyone safe on and around the school grounds, we kindly ask all parents and carers to use only the designated parking areas—the turning circle and the church car park—when dropping off or collecting children.

Please avoid parking on pavements, as this blocks pathways for pedestrians, especially those with prams or young children.

We understand that parking can be difficult during busy times. If possible, consider using the Park and Ride facility on Black's Road and walking your child to school. This helps reduce congestion and adds a healthy dose of physical activity to your morning routine.

By following these guidelines, we can all contribute to a safer, more respectful environment for our children and the wider school community.



#### **Breakfast Club**

Our Breakfast Club for P2-P7 will run daily from 8:15am to 9:00am at a cost of £2.20 per child, payable via SchoolMoney.

#### Please note:

- Last admission is at 8:45am P1 pupils will be able to join from Monday 6th October P1-P3 Breakfast Club is held in the Dining Hall of the Birch Building
- P4-P7 Breakfast Club takes place in the Dining Hall of the Rowan Building

Breakfast Club is a great way for children to enjoy a healthy start to their day in a relaxed and social environment.

#### **Healthy Break**

We encourage pupils to bring a healthy mid-morning snack, such as fresh fruit, vegetables, or bread-based items with sugar-free fillings.

Only milk and water are permitted during break and lunch, with water available throughout the day.

Please be mindful of allergies when packing your child's snack or lunch.

As part of our Eco-School commitment, we ask families to support us by using reusable water bottles, lunch boxes, and bags, and avoiding single-use plastics.
