P7 pupils will take part in 'What's Inside', an interactive session designed to help them understand and manage the physical and emotional changes that often bring concern and anxiety at this stage of life.



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Meanwhile, P6 pupils will engage in 'Choices and Changes', a one-hour workshop introducing the key changes associated with puberty in a sensitive and age-appropriate way.

All Love for Life programmes are designed to be engaging, informative, and suitable for the age group, helping children to learn, reflect, and grow in their understanding of this important area.

The Safer Schools NI app is a free interactive safeguarding tool designed for school communities across Northern Ireland.





Dear Parent/Carer

During the month of October, we will be participating in the **NSPCC's Speak out. Stay safe** online programme. This is a safeguarding programme which aims to help children understand abuse in all its forms and to recognise the signs of abuse in a child-friendly way. Children are taught to speak out if they are worried, either to a trusted adult or Childline. This consists of an online assembly and supporting classroom-based activities. In the online assembly, the 'Speak out. Stay safe.' messages are delivered in a fun and interactive way with the help of their mascot, Buddy, as well as special guest appearances from Ant and Dec. There are separate Key Stage 1 and Key Stage 2 assemblies and activities, based on age-appropriate materials.
